- Students have been taking the state mandated exams in grades 6-11. The online testing was very problematic statewide last year. This year has been much less problematic in terms of technology issues. However, the state has presented challenges in transitioning from End of Course (EOC) tests to the new Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA). The screen shot below from OSPI's website shows the rapidly changing environment students and teachers navigate. The environment doesn't stabilize until the class of 2019 and thereafter. The difficulty now is preparing students for the SBA as a high stakes test without reliable state guidance on curriculum options. If you feel the same way and have a legislative contact please ask them to consider stabilizing the testing environment.


