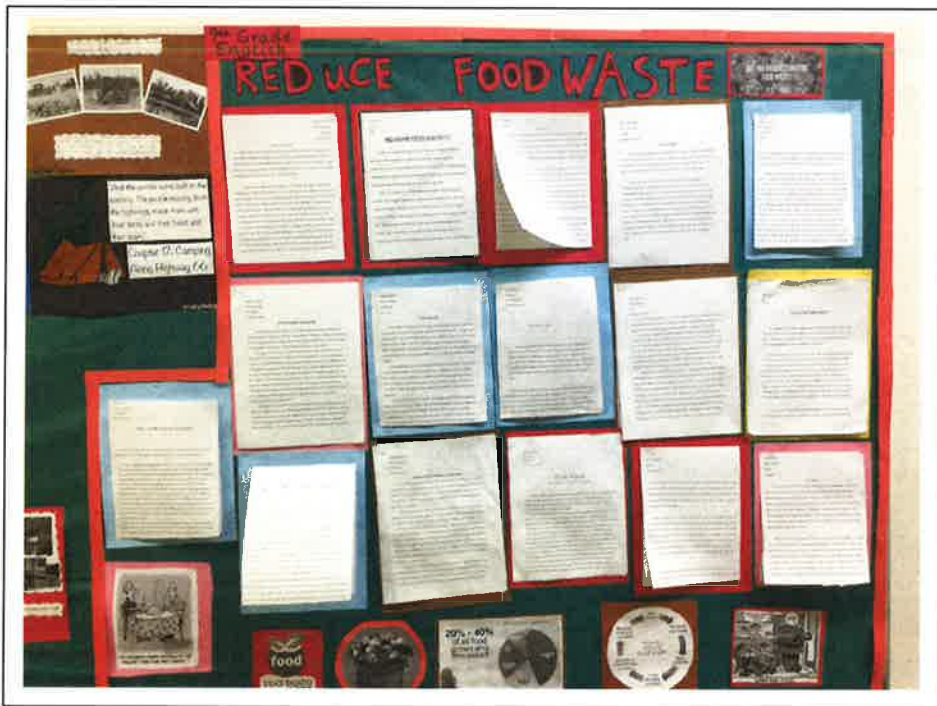

Middle School Students made a decorative coat rack.

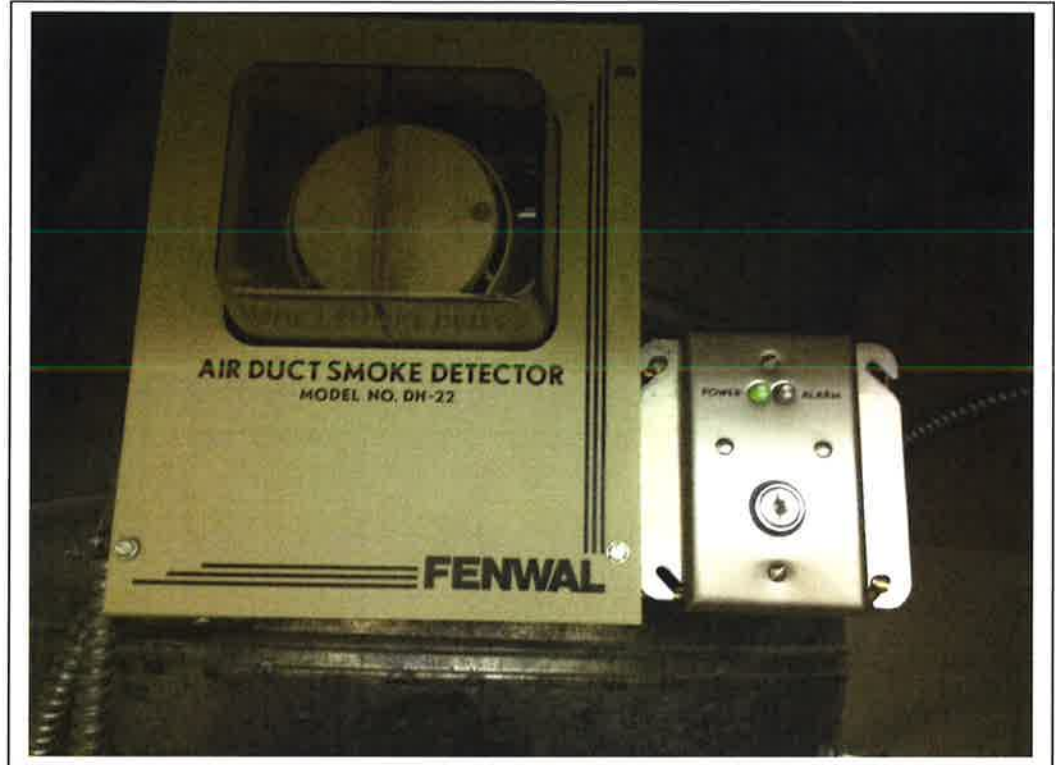


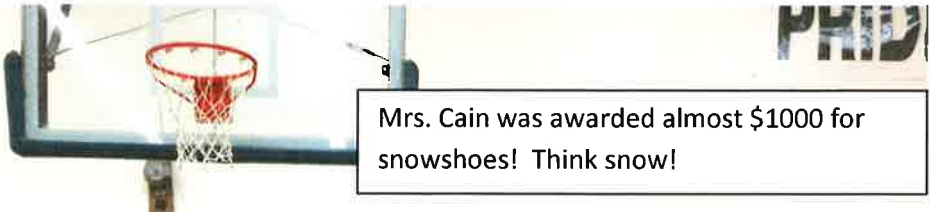
Shop students learn how to frame and wire a wall. The next step will be to add drywall.
